This office received an anonymous phone call on August 10 at 7 PM. The following information was given: *291-7700* On Friday, August 9, 1963 at 7:30AM, Warren Hilton, who works at the Cincinnati Gear Co., Mariemont, came in to work and appeared nervous and told his fellow workers he had slept in his automobile. He worked about ~~w~~ 2 hours and went home. He has worked for the Gear Co. for about 3 years and at present is divorced. He owns a light blue, 1962 Chev Conv. He works as a lathe operator and is described as a MW 20s, 5'8", 180 lbs. This name was checked through the Cincinnati P D Bureau of Identification, but no record was found.

Reference your message Aug. 20, 1963 concerning Patricia Rebholz case. I am sending the Post & Times Star along with this letter. As I mentioned in my previous letter, the finder of the paper was a young man by the name of Robert Trentman, 59 Lillian Drive, Belleville, Ill. He found the paper lying on a country road approximately five miles from a radar station operated by Scott Air Force Base, Ill. Mr. Trentman found the paper at approximately 5 P.M. 10, Aug. 63 while making a stop sign at the junction of Jefferson Road and Plum Hill Road in St. Clair Co. I am sure that Mr. Trentman had no connection with the case. He works for Kilian Bldg. Mtl. Co. located in this city and he was there every day that week except Saturday. The weather was clear and fair in that 24 hr. period. The newspaper has been handled by quite a few people. It was thought by this officer that an Airman going to the Radar Sta. dropped the paper.
